HERE'S SOME WATERFRONT WISDOM

- Keep your cigarette butts off the beach and out of the water. More than a million were picked up from U.S. beaches on one day last year!
- When purchasing refreshments, choose recyclable containers (and recycle them!) instead of foamed cups with plastic lids and straws.
- Take sandwiches and snacks from home in reusable containers rather than in plastic food bags.
- Leave the beach a cleaner place than you found it. Take a trash bag on your beach walk and carefully pick up litter.
- If you run a waterfront business, maintain your garbage cans with lids and pick up debris before it gets in the water.



AND SOME BOATING BASICS

- Designate a permanent onboard trash can. Use a bucket with a lid or other sturdy container.
- Help guests understand that on your boat, no trash is thrown overboard.
 - Put empty cans back in your cooler to recycle ashore.
- If your trash blows overboard, go back and get it, carefully using the opportunity as “crew-overboard” practice.
- Bring used monofilament line back to recycling bins at your marina or tackle shop.
